

## SUNDAY'S READINGS

### Reading I: Acts 10:34a; 37-43


Peter's sermon builds on the revelation he received and as a special witness to the resurrection that he became. The promised forgiveness of sins is now certain through Jesus.

### Reading II: Colossians 3: 1-4

This selection, addressed to the citizens of an important city, urges them to think from a heavenly perspective, not an earthly one. Your Christian life is a hidden one but is made manifest by your lifestyle.

### The Gospel: John 20: 1-9, or 41

The empty tomb is discovered, and the risen Jesus first appears to Mary Magdalene. She in turn becomes His messenger to Peter and John. They in turn enter the tomb and see the burial cloths in one place and the head cloth neatly rolled up in another.



*Our Lord, Jesus Christ Has Risen!*

It is a time of celebration in our God, but we must keep up our efforts of prayers and sacrifices to unite ourselves to the Victor, Christ Jesus. Over the next 50 days of this Easter Season, we will hear how the Apostles and other disciples of our Lord continued to struggle in their faith and understanding. The battle continues for us as well. May we allow ourselves to be transformed by Christ's saving sacrifice that we may enter into eternal joy. May we not turn back to our former ways of sin, but may we go forth sharing the light, the joy and the love of our Lord to all.

**Divine Mercy Sunday** - (April 7, 2024): We will celebrate this great feast day with a Procession of the Blessed Sacrament immediately after the 9:30 AM Mass next Sunday while praying the Divine Mercy chaplet. If we have good weather, the altar servers and Knights of Columbus will lead us all through the park and back to Church. If it's bad weather, the servers alone guide the procession through the church. Come participate in God's mercy and help free souls from Purgatory.



**Happy Anniversary!** Our local *Knights of Columbus* council was established 100 years ago and is growing strong! Founded on the principles of charity, unity and fraternity, they seek to bring the faith alive in works. Recently, our council sponsored a Basketball Free Throw competition to support youth, donated coats to children in need, sponsored the Special Olympics and set up our parish Nativity displays. ## **Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC)**

### **#325 "What are the degrees that make up the sacrament of Holy Orders?"**

The sacrament of Holy Orders is composed of three degrees which are irreplaceable for the organic structure of the Church: the episcopate, the presbyterate and the diaconate."

### **#326 "What is the effect of episcopal ordination?"**

Episcopal ordination confers the fullness of the sacrament of Holy Orders. It makes the bishop a legitimate successor of the apostles and integrates him into the episcopal college to share with the Pope and the other bishops care for all the churches. It confers on him the offices of teaching, sanctifying, and ruling."

### **#327 "What is the office confided to a Bishop in a particular Church?"**

The bishop to whom the care of a particular Church is entrusted is the visible head and foundation of unity for that Church. For the sake of that Church, as vicar of Christ, he fulfills the office of shepherd and is assisted by his own priests and deacons."

**Saint of the Week:** *Melito of Sardis* (180 AD) was the bishop of Sardis near Smyrna and held a foremost place among the early Christian bishops in Asia due to his personal influence and his literary works, most of which have been lost. What has been recovered however, has provided a great insight into Christianity during the second century. Melito is remembered for his work on developing the first Old Testament Canon; he identified those scrolls and books which were inspired by God and belonged in the Bible. Many saints testified to Melito's holiness and esteemed him as a prophet, including Saints Jerome, Tertullian, Clement of Alexandria and Eusebius. Feast Day: 1 April.

**Saint Quote of the Week:** *"Prayer in Praise of Christ: Born as a son, led forth as a lamb, sacrificed as a sheep, buried as a man, He rose from the dead as a God, for He was by nature God and man. He is all things: He judges and so He is Law, He teaches and so He is Wisdom, He saves and so He is Grace, He begets and so He is Father, He is begotten and so He is Son, He suffers and so He is Sacrifice, He is buried and so He is man, He rises again and so He is God. This is Jesus Christ, to whom belongs glory for all ages."* - St. Melito of Sardis

**Word of the Week: Apathy** - the opposite of love; a lack of feeling in circumstances that call for a show of emotion. It involves a failure to care. The Book of Revelations (Rev 3:15-16) reveals what God will do to those with apathy: "I know your works; I know that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either cold or hot. So, because you are lukewarm, neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth."



### **First Friday Eucharistic Adoration.**

Come spend time with Jesus. Open your heart and let Him make a difference in your life. **Join us for First Friday Adoration, April 5, anytime between 4:00 – 7:00 PM. All are welcome to stop by for a few minutes, an hour or for however long you are able.** Father Mullins is also available for Confessions from 6:00 to 7:00 PM.

**Help to reengage Catholics** who have fallen away from the faith by simply extending an invitation to them to come with you to Mass, Stations, Adoration, Confession. This simple gesture may be all it takes to welcome back a person who has been away. Don't be surprised at the positive response you may receive.

**Catholics are obliged** to fulfill what has been called their "**Easter Duty.**" They are required to receive Holy Communion during the Easter time. This obligation can be fulfilled from the First Sunday of Lent until Trinity Sunday. Those conscious of serious sin are reminded of the obligation to confess their sins at least once a year during this time.

**The Easter (or Paschal) Candle** is located near the Baptismal Font, the exception being during the Easter season when it is placed next to the Ambo. Originating around the fourth century, this large Candle represents the Light of Christ and a new Paschal Candle is blessed and lit during each Easter Vigil. It is lit for every Baptism and the flame, the Light of Christ, is transferred to a candle given to the Baptized individual or to an adult family member when an infant is Baptized. The Candle is burned at every Mass during the Easter Season and will be lit at every Baptism and Funeral until next year's Easter Vigil.
