

Jesus offers His high priestly prayer after the Last Supper in which He not only asks His Father to protect His Eleven, but also has in mind Judas who is about to betray Him.



A day to celebrate our mothers is not enough. Mothers celebrated us in their wombs for nine months. They push us forth into life and light not just at our birth, but at each moment of our life. They encourage us, correct us, teach us, guide us, and love us into existence. Mothers often clean up after us, tend to our wounds, wipe away our tears, nourish us, and play with us. The Lord commands us to remember the total commitment, sacrifice and struggles our mothers make for us when He issued the fourth commandment: Honor your father and mother. Jesus gives us the perfect example of respect for His mother. As a child at the age of 12, Jesus obeyed His mother when He was lost in the Temple. Even as an adult at the age of 30, Jesus listened and obeyed His mother at the wedding at Cana. Even as He was dying on the cross, Jesus cared for His mother's needs when he commended Saint John to her care. May we recognize the gifts and sacrifices our mothers have made for us and respond with grateful hearts throughout our lives.

Grateful to our Blessed Mother, we will pray the Rosary in Church one half an hour before Mass every day in May. Come together as a family of faith to honor the Mother of Christ, and our spiritual mother.

Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC)

#343 "How is the sacrament of Matrimony celebrated? Since Matrimony establishes spouses in a public state of life in the Church, its liturgical celebration is public, taking place in the presence of a priest (or of a witness authorized by the Church) and other witnesses."

#344 "What is matrimonial consent? Matrimonial consent is given when a man and a woman manifest the will to give themselves to each other irrevocably in order to live a covenant of faithful and fruitful love. Since consent constitutes Matrimony, it is indispensable and irreplaceable. For a valid marriage the consent must have as its object true Matrimony, and be a human act which is conscious and free and not determined by duress or coercion."

#345 "What is required when one of the spouses is not a Catholic? A *mixed* marriage (between a Catholic and a baptized non-Catholic) needs for licetity the permission of ecclesiastical authority. In a case of *disparity of cult* (between a Catholic and a non-baptized person) a dispensation is required for validity. In both cases, it is essential that the spouses do not exclude the acceptance of the essential ends and properties of marriage. It is also necessary for the Catholic party to accept the obligation, of which the non-Catholic party has been advised, to persevere in the faith and to assure the baptism and Catholic education of their children."



Saint Quote of the Week: *"I went back each day for fifteen days, and each time, except one Monday and one Friday, the Lady appeared and told me to look for a stream and wash in it and to see that the priests build a chapel there. I must also pray, she said, for the conversion of sinners. I asked her many times what she meant by that, but she only smiled. Finally, with outstretched arms and eyes looking up to heaven, she told me she was the Immaculate Conception."* - St. Bernadette Soubirous



Saint of the Week: Bernadette Soubirous - (1844-1879) As a child from a poor French family in the city of Lourdes, Bernadette suffered from asthma and cholera. Uneducated, she had not made her first communion in 1858, the year she experienced 18 visions of a beautiful lady called the Immaculate Conception who asked for penance and pilgrimage. Bernadette remained unchanged by this extraordinary experience, and in 1866 she became a member of the Sisters of Charity. Chronically ill after 1875 with worsening asthma and tuberculosis of the bones, she died at age 35. When she was canonized in 1933, it was not because she was the visionary of Lourdes, but because of her simple life of prayer, devotion and obedience. Feast Day: 16 April.

Word of the Week: Apostles' Creed - a formula of belief, in twelve articles, containing the fundamental doctrines of Christianity, whose authorship Church tradition ascribes to the Apostles. Its full text reads: "I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He arose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy, catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen."

Receiving the Traveling Chalice

Thank you to the families who have signed up for this program, as we continue to pray for vocations. At the end of Mass, you will be invited to come forward to receive the chalice and a prayer card with pictures of our seminarians. Father Mullins will give a special blessing to the family. The family will take the chalice and prayer card home and place the chalice in a place of honor for the week. The family returns the chalice in the box, the following week, before Mass for another family to take home.


