On this Father's Day weekend, it is good to reflect on good Saint Joseph, the foster-father of Jesus Christ. Saint Joseph didn't have all the answers. He didn't know what to do when he discovered his wife, the Blessed Virgin Mary was pregnant by the Holy Spirit. He was filled with anxiety when the child Jesus was lost in the Temple. But it was critical for Saint Joseph to be the foster-father of Jesus. He sought the best for His family by discerning God's Will. He protected the Christ child and His mother from King Herod. He provided for the family through his work as a carpenter. He led the family in prayer as they went every sabbath to the synagogue and every year to celebrate the Passover in Jerusalem. Saint Joseph revealed a pure, chaste love to His wife. Finally, Saint Joseph prepared himself and thereby his family to prepare for their own death and entrance into eternal life with God our Father. We ask Saint Joseph to intercede for our fathers: may the Lord bless them for all their labors, guide them in their decisions, protect them from all harm, and one day rejoice to receive them in the heavenly kingdom. Happy Father's Day!



Saint of the Week: Romuald (950-1027AD) was born in Italy. Though he had always desired virtue and sanctity, he wasted the early part of his life in the service of the world and its pleasures. Then, when his father wished him to be present at a duel he was fighting, Romuald saw his father kill his enemy in the duel. The killing made such an impression upon Romuald that he decided to expiate it for forty days, as though he had committed the crime. In order to do this, Romuald retired to a Benedictine monastery of Saint Apollinare, near Ravenna, where he became the Abbot. He founded several monasteries, and also laid the foundations for the Order of the Camaldoli in Tuscany. Romuald was assailed by many temptations in the beginning of his spiritual life, but over time he conquered them through vigilance and prayer. Attempts were made on Romuald's life more than once as well, but God kept him safe. He also became the victim of calumny, which he bore in patience and silence. As he got older, Romuald increased his austerities instead of decreasing them. Feast Day: 19 June.

Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC)

#354 "What is the relationship between the sacraments and the death of a Christian? The Christian who dies in Christ reaches at the end of his earthly existence the fulfillment of that new life which was begun in Baptism, strengthened in Confirmation, and nourished in the Eucharist, the foretaste of the heavenly banquet. The meaning of the death of a Christian becomes clear in the light of the death and Resurrection of Christ our only hope. The Christian who dies in Christ Jesus goes "away from the body to be at home with the Lord" (*2 Corinthians 5:8*)."

#355 "What do funeral rites express? Although celebrated in different rites in keeping with the situations and traditions of various regions, funerals express the paschal character of Christian death in hope of the resurrection. They also manifest the meaning of communion with the departed particularly through prayer for the purification of their souls."

#356 "What are the main moments in funerals?

Usually, funeral rites consist of four principal parts: welcoming the body of the deceased by the community with words of comfort and hope, the liturgy of the Word, the Eucharistic Sacrifice, and the farewell in which the soul of the departed is entrusted to God, the Source of eternal life, while the body is buried in the hope of the resurrection."

Word of the Week: Archangel - a chief or ruling angel. The term occurs twice in the New Testament (Jude 5:9; I Thessalonians 4:16) and has two meanings in the Catholic vocabulary. In its wider sense, an archangel is any angel of higher rank, so that St. Michael is an archangel although he is the prince of the Seraphim. But more strictly, archangels are those angelic spirits who belong to the eighth or second last of nine choirs of angels. As distinct from guardian angels, archangels are messengers of God to men in matters of greater significance. Thus Raphael delivered Tobias' wife from demonic obsession (Tobit 12:6, 15) and traditionally is identified with the angel who moved the waters of the pool, where Christ worked his miracle (John 5:1-4). Gabriel was the angel of the Annunciation. St. Michael is the leader of the heavenly host, who fought and won against the rebellious spirits (Revelation 12:7-9).

This series is a unique opportunity to deepen your understanding and practice of these essential virtues. It is open to everyone, regardless of where you are in your faith journey.




