The casuistry used by the Pharisees against Jesus about the laws of purity for the Jews must yield, according to Jesus, to the higher law of internal purity within the soul.





Labor Day (1st Monday of September) is a federal holiday established in the 19th century to recognize the contributions of workers and to remember the importance of workers' rights. Catholic teaching views work as a vital part of human existence, a way to participate in God's creation, and a means of sanctification. Work is not just a way to make a living, but a path to growth, personal fulfillment, and human development. It's also a way to imitate Christ, who worked as a carpenter. Catholic teaching also states that workers have natural rights to work without coercion, and to demand safe working conditions that don't endanger their health or impair their development. Workers also have the right to productive work, fair wages, the right to organize and join unions, and the right to private property. Working conditions should also allow workers time for rest, recreation, community, and family. Among the Papal Encyclicals on labor are: *Rerum Novarum*, *Quadragesimo Anno*, *Gaudium et Spes*, *Laborum Exercens*, and *Caritas in Veritate*.

Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC)

#384 "What are the theological virtues?

The theological virtues have God himself as their origin, motive and direct object. Infused with sanctifying grace, they bestow on one the capacity to live in a relationship with the Trinity. They are the foundation and the energizing force of the Christian's moral activity and they give life to the human virtues. They are the pledge of the presence and action of the Holy Spirit in the faculties of the human being."

#385 "What are the theological virtues?"

The theological virtues are faith, hope, and charity."

#386 "What is the virtue of faith?"

Faith is the theological virtue by which we believe in God and all that he has revealed to us and that the Church proposes for our belief because God is Truth itself. By faith, the human person freely commits himself to God. Therefore, the believer seeks to know and do the will of God because "faith works through charity" (*Galatians 5:6*)."

#387 "What is hope?"

Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire and await from God eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit to merit it and to persevere to the end of our earthly life."

#388 "What is charity?"

Charity is the theological virtue by which we love God above all things and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God. Jesus makes charity the new commandment, the fullness of the law. "It is the bond of perfection" (*Colossians 3:14*) and the foundation of the other virtues to which it gives life, inspiration, and order. Without charity "I am nothing" and "I gain nothing" (*1 Corinthians 13:1-3*)."



Saint of the Week: Pope Gregory the Great (c. 540 – 604) was born in Rome to a wealthy family. He received a good education and became an expert in law, becoming the prefect of Rome at the age of 33. When his father died, Gregory converted his family villa into a

monastery and became a Benedictine monk. In 590, Gregory was proclaimed pope by popular acclamation, although he himself accepted it reluctantly. Gregory was direct and firm. He removed unworthy priests from office, forbade taking money for many services, emptied the papal treasury to ransom prisoners from the Lombards, and care for persecuted Jews and victims of plague and famine. He was greatly concerned with the conversion of England, sending 40 monks as missionaries from his own monastery. He is known for his reform of the liturgy and for strengthening respect for doctrine. Pope Gregory suffered from arthritis in his later years. He is the patron saint of musicians, singers, students and teachers. Feast day: 3 September.


