

### Reading II: Ephesians 3: 2-3a, 5-6


The author recounts Paul's role in announcing the divine plan. Its main point is the new inclusion of the Gentile world.

Jesus' birth is inserted into the political and social context. The wise men represent the Gentile world coming to Christ.





Epiphany means "manifestation; an event, action, or object that clearly shows or embodies something." The feast of the Epiphany identifies three events of the life of Christ



which reveals His divinity: Visit by the Wise Men, Baptism of our Lord, Wedding at Cana. The wise men were foreigners who followed a moving star that rested over the child Jesus; they worshiped Him and offered gifts which reveal who Christ is: gold, the king of metals for the King of Kings; frankincense, which lifts prayers up to heaven for the Son of God; myrrh, an embalming perfume to reveal He will sacrifice His life. In the Baptism of the Lord, the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus and the voice of the Father was heard saying, "This is my Beloved Son, listen to Him." Finally, during the Wedding at Cana, Jesus performs His first public miracle, the transformation of water into the best of wine.

May our words and actions be the shining light that clearly reveals that we belong to Christ. Use your time, talent and treasures and offer them as gifts in adoration and gratitude to our Lord. Consider making a resolution to read the Bible each day that you may hear the voice of the Father. Recognize that when we invite Jesus into our life, miracles will happen and He can transform us to be the best we can be. May this new year be happy and holy for you and your family.

### Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC)

#### #438 "What importance does the Church give to the Decalogue?

The Church, in fidelity to Scripture and to the example of Christ, acknowledges the primordial importance and significance of the Decalogue. Christians are obliged to keep it."

#### #439 "Why does the Decalogue constitute an organic unity?

The Ten Commandments form an organic and indivisible whole because each commandment refers to the other commandments and to the entire Decalogue. To break one commandment, therefore, is to violate the entire law."

#### #440 "Why does the Decalogue enjoin serious obligations?

It does so because the Decalogue expresses the fundamental duties of man towards God and towards his neighbor."

#### #441 "Is it possible to keep the Decalogue?

Yes, because Christ without whom we can do nothing enables us to keep it with the gift of his Spirit and his grace."



**Saint of the Week: John Neumann** (1811-1860) was born in 1811 in Bohemia (today, the Czech Republic). John entered the seminary and

was nearing ordination when he left for the United States. He joined the Redemptorists and served as a priest in New York, Maryland and Pennsylvania. John worked tirelessly to provide sacraments to Catholic immigrants and to care for their educational and medical needs. At this time in American history, anti-Catholicism was rampant. John Neumann ensured that Catholics were educated in their faith, and he also won many converts to the faith. Known for his piety, learning, and work ethic, in 1851 John Neumann was asked by Archbishop Kenrick to be his confessor and recommended that he become Bishop of Philadelphia. Pope Pius IX agreed and ordained him Bishop in 1852. John sought to visit all the parishes in the diocese as well as hospitals, orphanages, and religious communities. Because he spoke eight languages, he was able to hear confessions from many immigrants. He established the first parochial school system in America founding 40 new schools. He even published catechisms that remained in use until the publication of the Baltimore Catechism thirty-five years later. His pastoral zeal was evident until his final moments of life. After bringing Holy Communion to the sick, he collapsed and died in the street at age 48. He was buried at St. Peter's Redemptorist Church in Philadelphia. Visitors can view his incorrupt body lying beneath the main altar. Feast day: 5 January.

**Saint Quote of the Week:** "Everyone who breathes, high and low, educated and ignorant, young and old, man and woman, has a mission, has a work. We are not sent into this world for nothing; we are not born at random; we are not here, that we may go to bed at night, and get up in the morning, toil for our bread, eat and drink, laugh and joke, sin when we have a mind, and reform when we are tired of sinning, rear a family and die. God sees every one of us; He creates every soul, . . . for a purpose. He needs, He deigns to need, every one of us. He has an end for each of us; we are all equal in His sight, and we are placed in our different ranks and stations, not to get what we can out of them for ourselves, but to labor in them for Him. As Christ has His work, we too have ours; as He rejoiced to do His work, we must rejoice in ours also." - (St. John Neumann, from the sermon: "God's Will the End of Life".)

**Word of the Week: Bells** - hollow metal cups that make a ringing sound when struck or rung. When blessed, they are sacramentals of the Church. The Mass bell is a small handbell rung at the elevation of the Sacred Host and Chalice to direct the attention of the congregation to this most solemn part of the Mass. In many churches the tower bells are rung at dawn, noon and night to mark the Angelus prayer to remind people to sanctify each part of the day.

**This weekend we celebrate the Epiphany, also is the Time to Bless Homes.** The Blessing includes a "chalking" of the front door with the year and the letters "CMB" referring to the legendary names of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar or reference to the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" which means "May Christ bless this house." Another tradition is to tape the first Christmas card received with the image of the Magi above the inside of the front door. Both traditions remind us to seek and welcome Christ every time we pass through the doors of our family home.
