There are some terrible things that happen to people. Some people are rude and mean. When we can't change the situation and we certainly can't change other people, what are we to do? We can control how we respond to these negative situations. Today's Gospel focuses on the Beatitudes. It reveals that even though bad life situations may occur, or others may persecute us, we can still rejoice. For those who are faithful, they recognize that evil will only prevail for a little time; however, God and His love for us are eternal.

The children of Fatima, Francisco & Jacinta Marto and Lucia dos Santos experienced ridicule and persecution when they revealed that they saw an apparition of the Blessed Mother. Yet they rejoiced to see her and share her message even with her persecutors. All the hardships they endured, willingly and unwillingly, they offered in reparation for sinners. Their acts of loving penance served as a way of making amends for those who failed to show love to our Lord. They united their sacrifices in union with Christ's Holy Sacrifice of the Mass as a way to make up for the failure in love of others through sin.

May we not give a bad attitude to others; instead, may we reveal the beatitudes and help bring healing to souls.

Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC)

#455 "What does the fourth commandment require? It commands us to honor and respect our parents and those whom God, for our good, has vested with his authority."

#456 "What is the nature of the family in the plan of God? A man and a woman united in marriage form a family together with their children. God instituted the family and endowed it with its fundamental constitution. Marriage and the family are ordered to the good of the spouses and to the procreation and education of children. Members of the same family establish among themselves personal relationships and primary responsibilities. In Christ the family becomes the *domestic church* because it is a community of faith, of hope and of charity."

#457 "What place does the family occupy in society? The family is the original cell of human society and is, therefore, prior to any recognition by public authority. Family values and principles constitute the foundation of social life. Family life is an initiation into the life of society."

#458 "What are the duties that society has toward the family? Society, while respecting the principle of subsidiarity, has the duty to support and strengthen marriage and the family. Public authority must respect, protect and foster the true nature of marriage and the family, public morality, the rights of parents, and domestic prosperity."



Saint of the Week: *Francisco & Jacinta Marto* - (20th century)

The youngest children of Manuel and Olimpia Marto, Francisco and Jacinta were typical of Portuguese village children of the time.

They were illiterate but had a rich oral tradition to rely on, and they worked with their cousin Lúcia, tending the family sheep. These three children had monthly visions of the Virgin Mary at Fátima, Portugal, from May to October 1917. Mary asked the little shepherds to promote devotion to her Immaculate Heart and to pray the rosary daily. Jacinta was deeply affected by a terrifying vision of hell shown to the children at the third apparition. She became deeply convinced of the need to save sinners through penance and sacrifice, which the Virgin had reportedly instructed the children to make. Both Martos children died of influenza, Francisco at age 10 in 1919 and Jacinta at age 9 in 1920. Pope Francis canonized Francisco and Jacinta on his visit to Fatima to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the first apparition, 13 May 2017. The shrine of Our Lady of Fatima is visited by up to 20 million people a year. Feast day: 20 February.

Saint Quote of the Week: "I would like to console our Lord, and after that convert sinners so that they won't offend Him anymore." - Saint Francisco Marto.
"I am suffering a lot, but I offer everything for sinners, and in reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary." - Saint Jacinta Marto.

Word of the Week: Bethel - an ancient Canaanite town, formerly called Luz, located some twelve miles from Jerusalem. It was the place where Jacob had his vision of the ladder, and where the Israelites "consulted God" (Judges 21). The Ark of the Covenant was probably kept there for a time. From the Hebrew Beth'el, House of God.
