



## SUNDAY'S READINGS

### Reading I: Genesis 15: 5-12, 17-18

God lays Abram's uncertainties to rest by strengthening His promises with a covenant oath, as He appears amid the offerings as smoke and fire.

### Reading II: Philippians 3:17-4:1; or 3:20-4:1

Paul appeals to his readers to follow his example, as he models his own life after Christ's. He further notes that Christ will transform our mortal bodies to be like His own.

### The Gospel: Luke 9: 28b-36

The Transfiguration shows Christ revealing His glory to offset the shock of the first Passion prediction. The presence of Moses and Elijah testifies that Jesus will fulfill both the Law and the Old Testament Prophets.

As we experience warmer weather, it's a good time to plan some hikes up the mountain. Get some exercise, breathe in the fresh air, see the beauty of the landscape and view things from a different perspective. Our Lord invited a select group of Apostles to join Him on the journey up the mountain, where He was transfigured and became dazzling white. Many times, we can be down in the trenches, working in the dirt, so that we fail to see where we are being called. We too are called to that same glory and honor with Christ. We need to understand that glorified Christ is working beside us as well, even as we face struggles and difficulties and especially our cross. Be sure to take some time away from your busy schedules to reflect, to listen more attentively to His Word, to see where we have grown, where we are, and where the Lord desires to lead us. When we do so, we will be empowered to face anything with hope and joy.

### **Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC)**

#### **#470 "What is forbidden by the fifth commandment?"**

The fifth commandment forbids as gravely contrary to the moral law:

- *direct and intentional murder* and cooperation in it;
- *direct abortion*, willed as an end or as means, as well as cooperation in it. Attached to this sin is the penalty of excommunication because, from the moment of his or her conception, the human being must be absolutely respected and protected in his integrity;
- *direct euthanasia* which consists in putting an end to the life of the handicapped, the sick, or those near death by an act or by the omission of a required action;
- *suicide* and voluntary cooperation in it, insofar as it is a grave offense against the just love of God, of self, and of neighbor. One's responsibility may be aggravated by the scandal given; one who is psychologically disturbed or is experiencing grave fear may have diminished responsibility."

#### **#471 "What medical procedures are permitted when death is considered imminent?"**

When death is considered imminent the ordinary care owed to a sick person cannot be legitimately interrupted. However, it is legitimate to use pain-killers which do not aim at in death and to refuse "over-zealous treatment", that is the utilization of disproportionate medical procedures without reasonable hope of a positive outcome."

#### **#472 "Why must society protect every embryo?"**

The inalienable right to life of every human individual from the first moment of conception is a constitutive element of civil society and its legislation. When the State does not place its power at the service of the rights of all and in particular of the more vulnerable, including unborn children, the very foundations of a State based on law are undermined."

**Word of the Week: Bilocation** - multiple or simultaneous presence of the same substance or soul in two places distant from each other. Bilocations have been frequently reported in the lives of the saints, such as Padre Pio.

**Saint of the Week: Cyril of Jerusalem** (c. 315-386) was raised and educated in Jerusalem during the time of the Arian heresy. Cyril was ordained by St. Maximus and succeeded him as bishop of Jerusalem about 350. His episcopate lasted until his death, but he spent 16 years in exile, assisted by emperors influenced by the Arian bishop of Caesarea who claimed ecclesiastical jurisdiction over Jerusalem. The Council of Antioch sent St. Gregory of Nyssa to investigate Cyril and his diocese. He reported that Jerusalem was rife with factionalism and Arianism, but that Cyril was orthodox. Cyril is famous for his extant "catechetical instructions," some of which consist almost entirely of carefully woven biblical passages. Pope Leo XIII named him a doctor of the church in 1882. Feast day: 18 March.

**Saint Quote of the Week:** : "Since Christ Himself has said, 'This is My Body' who shall dare to doubt that It is His Body?" - St. Cyril of Jerusalem.

"Only a pure soul can boldly say: 'Thy kingdom come.' One who has heard Paul say, 'Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal bodies,' and has purified himself in action, thought, and word will say to God: 'Thy kingdom come!'" - St. Cyril of Jerusalem.

"Just as Christ, after His baptism and the coming upon Him of the Holy Spirit went forth and defeated the adversary, so also with you. After holy Baptism and the Mystical Chrism, having put on the full suit of armor of the Holy Spirit, you are to withstand the power of the adversary, and defeat him, saying, 'I am able to do all things in Christ, Who strengthens me.'" - St. Cyril of Jerusalem.

- Confessions: Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays: 7:00 AM and Saturdays: 4:00-4:45 PM.
- Lenten Confessions with extra priests: April 1: 7:00 PM St. Nick's; April 3: 7:00 PM Sacred Heart and April 6: 3:00 PM Assumption BVM.

The liturgical rite of the washing of the feet on Holy Thursday takes its inspiration from the Last Supper, where Jesus first washed the feet of his apostles and commanded them to do likewise (see Jn 13:4-14). - If living together, must be married through the Catholic Church.
- Supporting your Church to the best of your ability.
