



Catholics are obliged to fulfill what has been called their "Easter Duty." They are required to receive Holy Communion during the Easter time. This obligation can be fulfilled from the First Sunday of Lent until Trinity Sunday (June 15, 2025). Those conscious of serious sin are reminded of the obligation to confess their sins at least once a year during this time.



First Friday, May 2 4:00 to 7:00 PM Confessions 6:00 to 7:00 PM We mourn the passing of His Holiness Pope Francis, the 266<sup>th</sup> Pope.

He reminded the faithful that the Church is a hospital for the sinner and not just for the saints and righteous, transmitting hope for those who feel distant from Christ.



"Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is in the Lord" (Jeremiah 17:7).

May eternal rest be granted to Pope Francis and may his soul, and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

Last week, the Church grew deeper in faith, as two members of our community (Ashleigh Godbout and

Tori Heffelfinger) received the sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion. This deeper immersion in faith is a reminder to us all of the blessings God has given to us and how we are called to continue to live this gift of faith, grow deeper in it and share it with all. To turn away from the Lord in times of darkness, in times of struggle or confusion is to turn away from Truth and Mercy Himself as Saint Thomas first did. However, when Thomas turned back to the Church, and prayed with them, He encountered Christ our Light, our Peace and our Hope. May we always trust in Jesus, because His plan for us is eternal salvation.



Today, we celebrate **Divine Mercy Sunday,** recognizing how our Lord appeared to Saint Faustina asking that this

feast be proclaimed acknowledging the infinite mercy of God. Jesus ordered that a painting be made and provided the words for a chaplet to be offered especially for the conversion of sinners. For those who pray the chaplet, Christ revealed these promises: 1. "The souls that say this chaplet will be embraced by My mercy during their lifetime and especially at the hour of their death." (Diary, 754) 2. "When hardened sinners say it, I will fill their souls with peace, and the hour of their death will be a happy one." (Diary, 1541) 3. "When they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as a just Judge but as a merciful Savior." (Diary, 1541) 4. "Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death." (Diary, 687).

To celebrate this wondrous and merciful gift, our parish will have Adoration and Procession of the Blessed Sacrament after the 9:30 AM Sunday Mass followed by the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Come and immerse yourself in the mercy of God.

Word of the Week: Blue Army - an organization founded in 1946 to pray and sacrifice for the conversion of Russia and for world peace. The society is a response to one of the requests made by Our Lady at Fátima, Portugal, in 1917, recommending the recitation of the rosary and urging mortification for the conversion of sinners. The Blue Army was established after Pope Pius XII in 1942 consecrated the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The National Shrine of Blue Army is located at 674 Mountain View Road East, Ashbury, New Jersey and is a wonderful place of pilgrimage.



Saint of the Week: Louis de Montfort (1673-1716) born in France as the eldest surviving son of eighteen children, he entered the seminary in July 1695. As he was appointed librarian, his time at the seminary gave him the opportunity to study most of the

available works on spirituality and, in particular, on the place of the Virgin Mary in Christian life. He was ordained a priest in June 1700. Two years after his ordination, while serving as a chaplain at a hospital, he organized a group of women who became the Daughters of Wisdom. He began giving mission talks to educate the Catholic faithful and later founded the Society of Mary, known as the Montfort Missionaries. He spent his later years preaching, primarily in rural areas, and writing; his best-known works are "The Secret of Mary" and "True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary." Feast Day: April 28.



Saint Quote of the Week: : "If you put all the love of all the mothers into one heart it still would not equal the love of the Heart of Mary for her children." - Saint Louis de Montfort.

"Pray with great confidence, with confidence based upon the goodness and infinite generosity of God and upon the promises of Jesus Christ. God is a spring of living water which flows unceasingly into the hearts of those who pray." - Saint Louis de Montfort.

"All our perfection consists in being conformed to, united to, and consecrated to Jesus Christ. Hence, the most perfect of all devotions is, without a doubt, that which conforms us, unites us, and consecrates us perfectly to Jesus Christ. Now, since Mary is of all creatures the most conformed to Jesus Christ, it follows that among all devotions, what most consecrates and conforms a soul to our Lord is devotion to Mary, his Holy Mother, and that the more a soul consecrates itself to her, the more it will be consecrated to Jesus Christ."—St Louis de Montfort.

## Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC) #487 "What responsibility do human persons

have in regard to their own sexual identity? God has created human beings as male and female, equal in personal dignity, and has called them to a vocation of love and of communion. Everyone should accept his or her identity as male or female, recognizing its importance for the whole of the person, its specificity and complementarity."

#### #488 "What is chastity?

Chastity means the positive integration of sexuality within the person. Sexuality becomes truly human when it is integrated in a correct way into the relationship of one person to another. Chastity is a moral virtue, a gift of God, a grace, and a fruit of the Holy Spirit."

#### #489 "What is involved in the virtue of chastity?

The virtue of chastity involves an apprenticeship in self-mastery as an expression of human freedom directed towards self-giving. An integral and continuing formation, which is brought about in stages, is necessary to achieve this goal."

## #490 "What are the means that aid the living of chastity?

There are many means at one's disposal: the grace of God, the help of the sacraments, prayer, self-knowledge, the practice of an asceticism adapted to various situations, the exercise of the moral virtues, especially the virtue of temperance which seeks to have the passions guided by reason."




