

SUNDAY'S READINGS

Reading I: Genesis 14: 18-20

Melchizedek, translated as "King of Righteousness", is the first person in the Bible to be called a priest. He is a "type" of Christ the Messiah. He offers bread and wine, a celebratory meal, to bless Abram's victory.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 11: 23-26

Jesus fulfills Melchizedek's offering in a marvelous way. He gives to us Himself, under the appearances of bread and wine. This is the oldest account of the Eucharist, as given by St. Paul.

The Gospel: Luke 9: 11b-17

Apart from the Resurrection, the multiplication of the loaves is the only miracle recounted in all 4 Gospels. Of course, it foreshadows the miracle of the Eucharist, inaugurated at the Last Supper.

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). This feast honors Jesus Christ, Really,

Truly and Substantially Present under the appearances of bread and wine. This Presence happens through the change which the Church calls transubstantiation ("change of substance"), when at the Consecration of the Mass, the priest says the words which Christ Himself pronounced over bread and wine, "This is My Body," "This is My Blood," "Do this in remembrance of Me."

Who can receive our Lord? Baptized Catholics who have been properly catechized, are not in serious sin and who have fasted one hour from food or drink may receive Holy Communion at Mass. To receive Holy Communion, one should bow before the Lord, step forward and when the minister proclaims, "The Body of Christ" one should respond "Amen." and either receive Holy Communion on the tongue or in an open hand with the other hand underneath and immediately put the Host in your mouth. Then one should make a sign of the Cross and return to their pew for private prayer.

Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC) #519 "In what way do Christians participate in political and social life? The lay faithful take part directly in political and social life by animating temporal realities with a Christian spirit and collaborating with all as authentic witnesses of the Gospel and agents of peace and justice."

#520 "By what is love for the poor inspired? Love for the poor is inspired by the Gospel of the Beatitudes and by the example of Jesus in his constant concern for the poor. Jesus said, "Whatever you have done to the least of my brethren, you have done to me" (Matthew 25:40). Love for the poor shows itself through the struggle against material poverty and also against the many forms of cultural, moral and religious poverty. The spiritual and corporal works of mercy and the many charitable institutions formed throughout the centuries are a concrete witness to the preferential love for the poor which characterizes the disciples of Jesus."



On Friday, we celebrate the **Feast** of **the Sacred Heart** - the symbol of the love with which Jesus continually loves the eternal Father and all human beings without exception. The Sacred Heart is often depicted in Christian art as a flaming heart shining with divine

light, pierced by the lance-wound, encircled by the crown of thorns, surmounted by a cross, and bleeding. Sometimes, the image is shown shining within the bosom of Christ with his wounded hands pointing at the heart. The wounds and crown of thorns allude to the manner of Jesus' death, while the fire represents the transformative power of divine love. Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back to the 11th century. St. Margaret Mary Alacoque had multiple visions of the Sacred Heart between 1673 and 1675. However, it wasn't until 1856 when Pope Pius IX made the feast of the Sacred Heart into a universal celebration. The feast of the Sacred Heart takes place 19 days after Pentecost (June 27th this year). To celebrate, we will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 4:00-7:00 PM, Confessions from 6:00-7:00 PM, followed by a Mass in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

To be eligible to be a Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation you must be an active, registered parishioner, minimum of 3 months, who is:

- Fully Initiated (received Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation).
- Minimally 16 years of age.
- Attends Mass regularly on Sundays and Holy Days.
- If living together, must be married through the Catholic Church.
- Supporting your Church to the best of your ability.

Saint of the Week: John Fisher - (1469-1535) was a brilliant man who held several high offices: chaplain to a king's mother, chancellor of Cambridge University, and Bishop of Rochester, England. He dedicated himself to the well-being of his diocese and his university. He wrote several treatises on the Scriptures and on the defense of the faith. He was considered King Henry VIII's most trusted advocate. But then King Henry VIII, in his desire for an heir, demanded the annulment of his marriage to Catherine of Aragon so that he could marry Anne Boleyn. Bishop Fisher investigated the marriage and determined that the king and Catherine were validly married and that only death could separate them. Enraged by this outcome, King Henry VIII claimed that he was the head of the Church in England and forced all Catholic priests and bishops to sign the oath of succession or face death. Bishop Fisher was imprisoned in the Tower in April 1534. following year, he was made a cardinal by Pope Paul III, and King Henry retaliated by having him beheaded within a month. He shares this feast day with his friend and fellow martyr, Thomas More; their heads were impaled on London Bridge two weeks apart. Feast day: 22 June.

Saint Quote of the Week: "A good man is not a perfect man; a good man is an honest man, faithful and unhesitatingly responsive to the voice of God in his life." - St. John Fisher.

Word of the Week: Bribery - the payment or promise to pay something of value to induce another to do as one wishes or prescribes. It generally refers to those pledged to the common good who act for individual profit or for the briber's benefit. The Catholic Church teaches that bribery in any form is immoral. The guilt is equally divided among all active agents, and their culpability varies with circumstances.


