## SUNDAY'S READINGS

### Reading I: Acts 12: 1-11

Put in jail by Herod the Great's grandson Agrippa, St. Peter miraculously escapes from a well-guarded jail cell. God answers the early Church's prayer for him.

### Reading II: 2 Timothy 4: 6-8, 17-18

St. Paul, knowing his death is imminent, asserts that he has fulfilled his earthly mission as the evangelist to the Gentile nations.

### The Gospel: Matthew 16: 13-19

St. Peter is given the keys of the kingdom of heaven, symbols of his authority over the Church. "Bind and loose" refer to the task of the rabbis who were official interpreters of the Law. Here it signifies the forgiveness of sins.

### Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC) #521 "What is one's duty toward the truth?"

Every person is called to sincerity and truthfulness in acting and speaking. Everyone has the duty to seek the truth, to adhere to it and to order one's whole life in accordance with its demands. In Jesus Christ the whole of God's truth has been made manifest. He is "*the truth*". Those who follow him live in the Spirit of truth and guard against duplicity, dissimulation, and hypocrisy."

### #522 "How does one bear witness to the truth?"

A Christian must bear witness to the truth of the Gospel in every field of his activity, both public and private, and also if necessary, with the sacrifice of his very life. Martyrdom is the supreme witness given to the truth of the faith."

### #523 "What is forbidden by the eighth commandment?"

The eighth commandment forbids:

- *false witness, perjury, and lying*, the gravity of which is measured by the truth it deforms, the circumstances, the intentions of the one who lies, and the harm suffered by its victims;
- *rash judgment, slander, defamation and calumny* which diminish or destroy the good reputation and honor to which every person has a right;
- *flattery, adulation, or complaisance*, especially if directed to serious sins or toward the achievement of illicit advantages.

A sin committed against truth demands reparation if it has caused harm to others."

**Word of the Week: Brief, Papal** - A concise papal letter prepared by the Vatican Secretary of State and stamped with an impression of the papal ring. It is a less formal document and lacks the solemnity of a bull.

**Saint Quote of the Week:** *"All my life I have wanted to be a missionary. I have wanted to carry the gospel message to those who have never heard of God and the kingdom he has prepared for them."* --St Junipero Serra.

**Saint of the Week: Junipero Serra** (1713-1784) was born in Spain. He joined the Franciscan Friars Minor in 1730 and was ordained a priest a year later. He embarked for the port of Veracruz, Mexico, in 1749. He walked to present-day Mexico City—he developed a sore that would plague him for the rest of his life. But he continued traveling more than 24,000 miles to share the gospel with many as a missionary. He learned the languages of the indigenous people and founded many missions with native farming communities, including many of today's California cities: San Diego, San Francisco, Santa Monica, San Luis Obispo, Santa Clara, Santa Barbara, and Los Angeles. His vast social and educational work is recognized throughout the history of Mexico and the United States of America. He died in 1784. Canonized on September 23, 2015, in Washington, D.C., by Pope Francis during his apostolic journey to the United States of America. His feast day: 1 July.

- Supporting your Church to the best of your ability.




