Moses dismisses any excuses of the people for disobedience to the Law. This Law is made present through frequent teaching of it and discussion of its commands.

Reading II: Colossians 1: 15-20

Christ makes the living God visible. As His only Son, He inherits all of creation. He is also head of the Church and directs its members in how to live.

The Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

The Parable of the Good Samaritan, available only in Luke's Gospel, presents both a moral and a theological lesson. The moral one: love of neighbor must accompany love of God. The theological one: The holiness of the New Testament requiring one to care for others.

Please welcome Reverend Paschal Ayi Guddah, SMA who will hear Confessions and celebrate Masses this weekend in support of the

Mission Appeals. He was ordained in Madina, Ghana on July 20, 2019 for the Society of African Missions. As a missionary, he recognizes all peoples as our neighbor whom we are called to serve with mercy. Father Paschal served in the African state of Niger where he held Literacy classes, administered First Aid to students, led Catechetical Instruction classes and celebrated Mass for the people. He also traveled to visit rural homes and farms to pray with the people even though the roads are in poor condition. Although many are afraid to speak to foreigners like him, Father Paschal stated, "as a result of (God's) Love, I have responded freely without hesitation to go to areas where the Good News of Jesus has not yet reached." He explained, "there are challenges in all missionary work, but challenges can be conquered, (through Prayer, Patience and Passion)." Please offer your prayers and support for Father Paschal and his missionary work. The second collection this weekend is to support the missions.



Kateri Tekakwitha (1656-1680)
The daughter of a Mohawk chief and an Algonquin woman, Kateri was orphaned in a smallpox epidemic that left her blind and disfigured. She was baptized by a

French missionary visiting her people in upstate New York. But her faith and refusal to marry caused problems, and she fled to an Indian community near Montreal, where she was venerated by both French and Indian people for her mystical gifts and kindness. The "lily of the Mohawk" is the patron saint of Native Americans, refugees, and the disabled. At her canonization in 2012, Pope Benedict XVI prayed, "St. Kateri, protectress of Canada and the first Native American saint, we entrust to you the renewal of faith in the First Nations and throughout North America!"
Feast Day: 14 July.

Saint Quote of the Week: *"I am not my own; I have given myself to Jesus. He must be my only love. The state of helpless poverty that may befall me if I do not marry does not frighten me. All I need is a little food and a few pieces of clothing. With the work of my hands, I shall always earn what is necessary and what is left over I'll give to my relatives and to the poor. If I should become sick and unable to work, then I shall be like the Lord on the cross. He will have mercy on me and help me, I am sure."* - Saint Kateri Tekakwitha.

Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC)

#527 "What is required by the ninth commandment? The ninth commandment requires that one overcome carnal concupiscence in thought and in desire. The struggle against such concupiscence entails purifying the heart and practicing the virtue of temperance."

#528 "What is forbidden by the ninth commandment? The ninth commandment forbids cultivating thoughts and desires connected to actions forbidden by the sixth commandment."

#529 "How does one reach purity of heart?

In the battle against disordered desires the baptized person is able, by the grace of God, to achieve purity of heart through the virtue and gift of chastity, through purity of intention, purity of vision (both exterior and interior), discipline of the imagination and of feelings and by prayer."

#530 "What are the other requirements for purity? Purity requires *modesty* which, while protecting the intimate center of the person, expresses the sensitivity of chastity. It guides how one looks at others and behaves toward them in conformity with the dignity of persons and their communion. Purity frees one from wide-spread eroticism and avoids those things which foster morbid curiosity. Purity also requires a *purification of the social climate* by means of a constant struggle against moral permissiveness which is founded on an erroneous conception of human freedom."

Word of the Week: Burial, Christian – is a spiritual work of mercy whereby the community turns to the Lord in prayer to receive a deceased member and bring consolation to those who remain. A Christian burial, traditionally involves interment (burial in the ground) or entombment (burial in a mausoleum) with specific rites and rituals performed by a priest or deacon or even by a layperson, often including a graveside service, prayers, and readings from the Bible. If the burial is to take place in a cemetery that has not been consecrated, the grave should be individually blessed before a Catholic person is interred.





To be eligible to be a Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation you must be an active, registered parishioner, minimum of 3 months, who is:


- Fully Initiated (received Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation).


