SUNDAY'S READINGS

Reading I: Jeremiah 38: 4-6, 8-10

Jeremiah angered the princes and so he is thrown into a cistern as punishment for his preaching. His speeches were hampering soldiers in their duty and people in their daily lives. But the king's servant led a rescue effort and Jeremiah was freed.

Reading II: Hebrews 12: 1-4

The author imagines the faithful to be runners in a stadium race, watched by the heroes of biblical history. They must look to Jesus and not grow faint-hearted as they race to the ultimate victory.

The Gospel: Luke 12: 49-53

Jesus wants to "cast a fire," meaning not only to bring forth God's presence and love into the world, but also His judgment of sinners and divine purification. Loyalty to Him He says is more important than family unity. True peace only comes if we embrace Him in faith.

For a fire to grow, there needs to be all three elements of the fire triangle: heat, fuel and oxygen. Christ desires to set our world on fire with His love for us. Spiritual oxygen would be our daily prayers. Spiritual fuel could be our charitable acts, which others can see and imitate. Spiritual heat would be drawing closer to Christ's heart through the sacraments. Unfortunately, there are some members of our family who were hurt in the past who want to throw a wet blanket on the whole situation. As a result, there come about divisions among family members. We desire our loved ones to experience a full relationship with Christ and the eternal glory of heaven, but they push back or even find fault with us. It's important to stress that we don't go to Church because we are better than others. We go to Church because we are sinners and we need a Savior. We are weak and therefore we need God's grace to raise us up again. Imagine how much deeper into sin we would fall if we didn't go to Church regularly!

May we seek to allow the flame of God's love to grow within us that we may be light to our family members who struggle in darkness of doubt, grief or loneliness. Developing a firm faith in our families early on, consistently practice and providing positive examples of virtues and right choices help keep families united to Christ and one another. May we turn to the Blessed Mother who formed the Holy Family to guide our families to the peace and unity of her Son.

Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC)

#545 "Why is our prayer efficacious?

Our prayer is efficacious because it is united in faith with the prayer of Jesus. In him Christian prayer becomes a communion of love with the Father. In this way we can present our petitions to God and be heard: "Ask and you will receive that your joy may be full". (*John 16:24*.)

#546 "How did the Virgin Mary pray?

Mary's prayer was characterized by faith and by the generous offering of her whole being to God. The Mother of Jesus is also the new Eve, the "Mother of all the living". She prays to Jesus for the needs of all people."

#547 "Is there a prayer of Mary in the Gospel?

Along with the prayer of Mary at Cana in Galilee, the Gospel gives us the *Magnificat* (*Luke 1:46-55*) which is the song both of the Mother of God and of the Church, the joyous thanksgiving that rises from the hearts of the poor because their hope is met by the fulfillment of the divine promises."

Saint of the Week: Bernard of Clairvaux (1091-1153) was born in France. In 1110 he began his religious life at the Abbey of Cîteaux. He was sent to Clairvaux, where he founded a monastery of which he was appointed abbot and where he spent the rest of his life. He developed a contemplative life of prayer and fasting. He reformed the Cistercian Order, restoring its forgotten charisms of humility and spirituality. He made pastoral journeys to promote peace and unity in the Church; he also mediated between kings and between them and the Church. By the time of his death, he had founded 163 monasteries in different parts of Europe, and the Order expanded to 343. He was canonized by Alexander III in 1174 and proclaimed a Doctor of the Church by Pius VIII. In 2006, Pope Benedict XVI declared that Saint Bernard deserved the title of 'Marian Doctor'. Saint Bernard compares the Virgin Mary to the star that sailors keep an eye on so as not to stray, saying: 'In the waves of the vicissitudes of this world, when instead of walking on land you feel like you are being tossed between waves and storms, do not take your eyes off the splendor of this star, if you do not want to be swallowed up by the waves ... Look at the star, invoke Saint Mary . . . If you follow her, you will not go astray. If she protects you, you will not be afraid; if she guides you, you will not tire; if she is favorable, you will reach your goal.' Feast Day: August 20.

Saint Quote of the Week: "We are to love God for Himself, because of a twofold reason; nothing is more reasonable, nothing more profitable." - St. Bernard.

"The true measure of loving God is to love him without measure." - St. Bernard.

"Truly, love is delightful and pleasant food, supplying, as it does, rest to the weary, strength to the weak, and joy to the sorrowful." - St. Bernard.

Word of the Week: Calumny - injuring another person's good name by lying. It is doubly sinful, in unjustly depriving another of his good name and in telling an untruth. Since calumny violates justice, it requires making reparation for the foreseen injury inflicted. Hence the calumniator must try, not only to repair the harm done to another's good name, but also to make up for any foreseen temporal loss that resulted from the calumny, for example, loss of employment or customers. (Etym. Latin *calumnia*, a false accusation, malicious charge; from *calvi*, to deceive.)
