This weekend, we celebrate the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. "To dedicate or consecrate" a place to God is a ritual that is found in every religion. To "reserve" a place to God is an act of recognizing His glory and honor. When the Emperor Constantine granted full liberty to Christians in 313AD, they did not spare in order to construct places for the Lord – numerous are the churches constructed at that time. Constantine himself also constructed churches, one of which he was a magnificent basilica on the Caelian Hill in Rome, over the ancient Lateran Palace, which Pope Sylvester I dedicated to Christ the Savior (324AD). A chapel dedicated to Saint John the Baptist was built inside it which served as the baptistry. This moved Pope Sergius III to dedicate it to Saint John the Baptist as well. Lastly, Pope Lucius II also dedicated it to Saint John the Evangelist in the 12<sup>th</sup> century. Thus, the name of this Papal Basilica is the Basilica of the Most Holy Savior and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist in the Lateran. Christians consider the Basilica to be the mother church of all churches in the world. It contains the cathedra (seat) of the Bishop of Rome, our pope. The church was destroyed several times in the course of the centuries, and always rebuilt. The final reconstruction took place under the pontificate of Benedict XIII. The church was rededicated in 1724. It was at that time that the feast celebrated today was established and extended to the universal Church. ### **Learn and Live the Faith (Compendium of CCC)**

#### **#578 "What is the origin of the *Our Father*?"**

Jesus taught us this Christian prayer for which there is no substitute, the *Our Father*, on the day on which one of his disciples saw him praying and asked him, "Lord, teach us to pray" (*Luke* 11:1). The Church's liturgical tradition has always used the text of Saint Matthew (6:9-13)."

#### **#579 "What is the place of the *Our Father* in the Scriptures?"**

The *Our Father* is the "summary of the whole Gospel" (Tertullian), "the perfect prayer" (Saint Thomas Aquinas). Found in the middle of the Sermon on the Mount (*Matthew* 5-7), it presents in the form of prayer the essential content of the Gospel."

#### **#580 "Why is it called the "Lord's Prayer"?"**

The *Our Father* is called the "Oratio Dominica", that is, the Lord's Prayer because it was taught to us by the Lord Jesus himself."

**Saint of the Week: Andrew Avellino** (1521-1608) was born in Italy. He received a solid Christian education from a priest uncle, with whom he lived until his adolescence. He entered the seminary and was ordained a priest in 1545. He lived an intense spirituality, guided by a Theatine priest. For two years he worked to reform the women's monastery of San Archangelo in Baiano; however, his severity and uprightness of life provoked intrigue among the nuns, civil authorities, and the townspeople. The animosity generated by his holiness led his enemies to make an attempt on his life. Once he recovered, he joined the Theatines of Saint Paul—a religious order founded in 1524 by Saints Cajetan and John Peter Caraffa, Bishop of Teate and future Pope Paul IV. Upon professing in 1558, he chose the name Friar Andrew and added to the vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience those of obeying God's will and perfecting his service to Him. He served as novice master and superior at the convent in Naples. One day, at the beginning of the Eucharistic celebration, he suffered a stroke, which resulted in his death before the altar. He was canonized in 1712 by Clement XI. He is the protector against sudden death and strokes. Feast day: November 10.

**Word of the Week: Capital Punishment** - the death penalty imposed by the state for the punishment of grave crimes. St. Paul expressly says: "The state is there to serve God for your benefit. If you break the law, however, you may well have fear: the bearing of the sword has its significance" (Romans 13:4). However, during our times and with our abilities in this country, we can protect society from further crimes of an individual by imprisoning those who commit grave crimes. Through imprisonment, it allows a person to pay for their crimes and also repent of their sins.

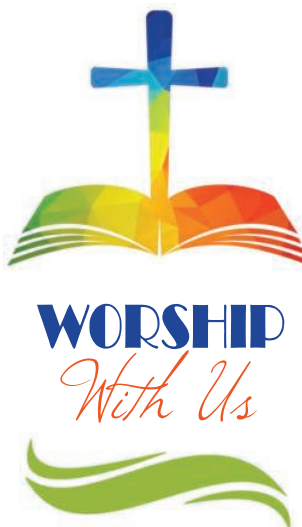
